

The course aimed to provide a platform for students to learn spoken Sanskrit, with a focus on practical communication skills, pronunciation, and basic conversational abilities.

Course Details:

The Spoken Sanskrit add-on course was designed as a non-credit, extracurricular programme. It was structured to be accessible to the students of the Department of Sanskrit. The course duration was 30 hours, with classes held from 01/12/2018-11/12/2018 for three hours each day.

Outcome:

The introduction of the Spoken Sanskrit add-on course yielded several positive outcomes. Students gained a deeper understanding and appreciation of the cultural and historical importance of Sanskrit. Participants developed basic spoken Sanskrit skills, including the ability to hold simple conversations and comprehend Sanskrit texts. The non-credit format interest in Sanskrit studies, leading some students to explore more advanced courses in the language.

Challenges:

Despite its successes, the Spoken Sanskrit course also faced some challenges. Some students found it challenging to accommodate the course schedule alongside their regular academic commitments. Ensuring the long-term sustainability of the course in terms of funding and faculty support was a concern.

Recommendations:

To further enhance the effectiveness and sustainability of the Spoken Sanskrit add-on course, we recommend the following. 1. Allocate additional resources for instructor training and the development of course materials. 2. Offer flexible scheduling options to accommodate students' diverse timetables. 3. Increase promotion and awareness of the course to attract a wider student audience.

Conclusion:

Spoken Sanskrit course has been a positive step toward promoting the study of Sanskrit and its cultural heritage. While facing some challenges, the course has achieved its primary objective of fostering an appreciation for the language and culture among students. With continued support and improvements, it has the potential to grow and become a valuable asset to our institution.
