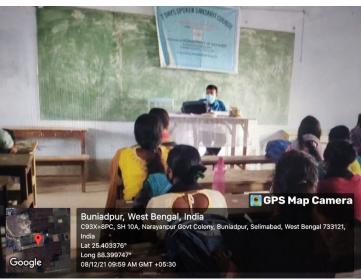

The 30 Hours' Add-on Course on Spoken Sanskrit was conducted at Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya with the aim of promoting linguistic diversity, cultural enrichment, and fostering a deeper connection with our heritage. Course Details:
