# **<u>1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY</u>**

# **1.1 INTRODUCTION**

Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya, a government-aided general degree undergraduate college, was founded on June 13, 2007. Despite its recent incorporation into the jurisdiction of Buniadpur Municipality, the college maintains a tranquil rural setting, free from urban disturbances, and is conveniently located just 1.5 km from Buniadpur Railway Station along the SH-10A highway. Originally affiliated with the University of North Bengal at its inception, the college transitioned to permanent affiliation with the University of Gour Banga in 2008. It has been recognized by the UGC under Section 2(f) since June 3, 2013, and under Section 12(B) since January 18, 2017.

Occupying **4.23 acres** of land, Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya serves a student population primarily from economically and educationally disadvantaged backgrounds, including Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Minorities, and other backward classes. The majority of its students are first-generation learners who benefit from the college's proximity to their homes, pursuing undergraduate degrees, diplomas, or certificates following the CBCS & NEP-2020 course patterns.

The academic offerings at Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya include B.A. General and Honours programmes in six subjects—Sanskrit, Bengali, English, History, Political Science, and Education and two additionl general subjects, Sociology and Philosophy (as per CBCS) & 4/3 Years' B.A. Programmes in all above 8 subjects(as per NEP-2020 Curriculum). Despite its modest teaching staff, which includes 4 substantive post holders, 8 State Aided College Teachers (SACTs) and 5 Visiting Faculty, the college is committed to providing a quality educational experience to a robust student body.

Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya employs an engaging and dynamic teaching-learning methodology that fosters critical thinking. The evaluation strategy extends beyond university exams to include regular internal assessments and various other methods. The college is proactive in enhancing student learning through diverse programmes, seminars, workshops, add-on courses, and skill-development initiatives. It boasts a well-equipped library with e-learning resources, offers scholarships, and provides career counseling and placement services.

In addition to academic pursuits, the college emphasizes community engagement and features ICT-based facilities, security measures, anti-ragging policies, a canteen, and promotes participation in sports and cultural activities. It also demonstrates a commitment to environmental sustainability, ensuring a holistic and enriching educational environment for all its students.

### Institutional Strength

1. Located in the newly established Buniadpur Municipality with a predominantly rural backdrop, Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya extends crucial access to higher education for predominantly economically and socially disadvantaged students.

2. The college adopts a co-educational, interdisciplinary approach, fostering an inclusive environment that

embraces religio-cultural diversity.

3. A commitment to transparency permeates all aspects of the college, including its financial, academic, administrative, and operational practices.

4. The admission process is fully online, emphasizing merit-based selection in compliance with government guidelines.

5. The campus is eco-friendly, spanning 4.23 acres of land that promotes environmental awareness.

6. The college boasts a vibrant herbal garden that not only enhances biodiversity but also serves as an educational resource on medicinal plants and sustainable practices.

7. Security is a top priority, with clearly defined campus boundaries, emergency exits, dedicated security personnel, and an extensive network of CCTV cameras for comprehensive surveillance.

8. The campus is strictly ragging-free, ensuring a safe and respectful environment for all students.

9. Active engagement in community service is encouraged through regular activities of the NSS Unit and NCC Coy.

10. Classrooms are equipped with portable ICT facilities to enhance learning experiences.

11. The college features a fully-equipped computer laboratory.

12. Collaborations with other institutions enrich the academic environment through faculty and student exchanges and joint initiatives like seminars, workshops, skill development, and cultural and sports events.

13. A variety of scholarships are available, including Kanyashree, Aikyashree, Oasis, SVMCM (HES) and also Free Studentships.

14. The curriculum is augmented with Add-on courses that broaden educational opportunities.

15. The library is well-stocked and automated, featuring subscriptions like N-list and systems such as KOHA (initially installed) and presently e-Granthalaya for enhanced access and management.

16. Soft skills development, self-defense training, and yoga classes are regularly organized to support student well-being and personal growth.

17. Career counseling is provided, with guidance available for both public and private sector opportunities.

18. The college facilitates placement opportunities in collaboration with the Kotibarsha Institute of Technology and Management, particularly in the hospitality sector.

19. Campus-wide Wi-Fi connectivity ensures that students and faculty have access to online resources anywhere on campus.

20. A canteen is available on-site to cater to the dietary needs of the college community.

21. The college actively supports cultural activities and sports, fostering a well-rounded campus life.

22. Committed to environmental sustainability, the institution implements effective waste management practices to reduce, reuse, and recycle waste.

### **Institutional Weakness**

As a relatively new establishment, Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya faces several challenges that currently overshadow its strengths. These weaknesses, prioritized for attention, include:

**1. Geographical Isolation**: Despite being under the jurisdiction of Buniadpur Municipality, the college's location in a rural and marginalized area restricts accessibility and development opportunities.

**2. Faculty Shortage:** The college suffers from a significant shortage of permanent faculty members, with only 4 full-time substantive teaching faculty covering 8 subjects. This shortfall is filled by State-Aided College Teachers and visiting faculties, but no new permanent teaching posts have been created or sanctioned since the college's inception, resulting in a high student-to-teacher ratio.

**3. Staffing Challenges:** The administrative and library staff also face shortages, with only 8 permanent members on a sanctioned 11 posts, supplemented temporarily by skilled and semi-skilled job workers. This not only affects administrative efficiency but also places additional strain on the existing staff.

**4. Funding Insufficiency:** The college has struggled with inadequate funding for academic and non-academic infrastructure, relying solely on its own resources. Since the 2018-19 session, no state government funding has been received, nor have any development grants from the UGC, as central assistance is contingent upon accreditation by NAAC, which poses a particular challenge for newer institutions.

**5. Limited Resources:** The existing computer laboratory is insufficiently equipped for the needs of students, faculty, and administrative operations, reflecting a high ratio of students per computer.

**6. Language Lab Absence:** Financial constraints have prevented the establishment of a planned language lab, which is crucial for enhancing language skills across the curriculum.

**7. Lack of Accommodation Facilities**: The absence of student hostels for both boys and girls and any staff quarters is a significant gap in providing comprehensive support for out-of-town students and faculty.

**8. Inadequate Infrastructure:** The college faces difficulties in effectively managing its academic systems, including the CBCS and NEP-2020 course structures, due to insufficient infrastructure like classrooms and computer facilities.

**9. Research Infrastructure Deficit**: There is a notable lack of infrastructure to support research initiatives, which are essential for the academic programs outlined in the NEP-2020 syllabus, particularly the 3-year General degree and 4-year Honours programs.

### **Institutional Opportunity**

At Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya, we recognize that challenges are merely opportunities in disguise. With a robust desire for quality education prevalent in the local community, we see vast potential to expand and innovate. Embracing the gradual nature of building a prestigious educational institution, we are committed to being a beacon of knowledge for economically and educationally disadvantaged communities, contributing to both local and national educational advancement.

1. Expansion of Access to Education: There is significant potential to extend educational opportunities, especially for students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, increasing their access to higher education.

**3. Student Progression:** Monitoring and enhancing student progression in higher education and employment pathways is a significant challenge that requires focused strategies.

**4. Research Funding:** Obtaining research funding is essential to foster a culture of research and innovation within the institution.

**5.** E-Governance Implementation: Instituting effective e-governance is vital for streamlining administrative processes and boosting operational efficiency.

**6. Educational Alignment:** Adapting to the National Education Policy-2020 and the CBCS course structure as outlined by the University of Gour Banga presents challenges in meeting evolving educational standards.

**7. Library Resources:** Expanding the library's collection to support a diverse academic program remains a critical challenge.

**8. Research Environment**: Creating a conducive research atmosphere within the institution is crucial to promote and facilitate scholarly activities.

**9. Infrastructure Maintenance:** Maintaining and enhancing existing infrastructure and assets is key to ensuring functionality and a conducive learning environment.

**10. Accommodation Facilities:** Constructing staff quarters and student hostels is a significant challenge due to funding shortages.

**11. Language and Communication Skills:** Enhancing the communication skills of first-generation learners is essential for their academic success and integration.

12. Course Development: Engaging with higher authorities to introduce need-based and interdisciplinary

courses requires ongoing effort and strategic planning.

**13. Department Expansion:** Creating additional departments to accommodate more students is necessary to foster inclusivity and academic growth.

**14. Career Counseling and Placement:** Strengthening career counseling and placement efforts is crucial amidst ever-changing job markets.

**15.** Competitive Examinations and Higher Studies: Encouraging students to undertake competitive examinations and pursue higher studies is vital for maintaining high academic standards.

**16. Gender Inclusivity:** Motivating female students to focus on career and education is a persistent challenge, central to our goals of gender inclusivity and empowerment.

## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

### **Curricular Aspects**

Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya, affiliated with the University of Gour Banga, stands out for its robust curriculum planning and delivery processes, ensuring a high standard of academic excellence. Academic calendars are meticulously prepared, and continuous evaluation mechanisms are in place to monitor student progress effectively. Interdepartmental faculty exchanges foster a collaborative learning environment, while innovative teaching methods enhance the learning experience.

### **Curriculum Flexibility and Enrichment:**

The college offers a variety of Add-On, Certificate, and Value-Added Courses tailored to meet the practical needs of students. These courses emphasize entrepreneurial skills and holistic well-being. Additionally, the curriculum promotes awareness of crucial topics such as Professional Ethics, Human Values, Gender, Environment, and Sustainability, both within the syllabus and through extracurricular initiatives. Financial aid is available for deserving students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds through a book bank facility. The college supplements academic learning with co-curricular activities such as field trips and industrial visits, fostering overall growth. Regular national conferences contribute to academic enthusiasm and knowledge enhancement.

Faculty, predominantly holding M.Phil/Ph.D degrees, are recruited in accordance with UGC guidelines, ensuring a highly qualified teaching staff. Innovative teaching tools like smart boards and projectors enrich learning experiences. During the pandemic, the college developed a customized web interface for live digital classes, enhancing accessibility to education.

Continuous evaluation is ensured through a robust internal assessment system encompassing group discussions, assignments, tests, and projects. The college's online examination portal proved invaluable during the pandemic, ensuring uninterrupted assessment processes. Results are meticulously reviewed in departmental meetings, with student grievances addressed by an Examination Committee.

The curriculum is designed to impart not only knowledge but also life skills, moral values, and self-reliance, preparing students for successful placements and further education. Admissions adhere strictly to University of Gour Banga guidelines and Government of West Bengal directives. The college follows the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and has recently adopted the NEP-2020, enhancing educational quality and relevance.

Various teaching methods including lectures, interactive sessions, ICT-based learning, and excursions cater to diverse learning needs. Teachers act as mentors, addressing academic and extracurricular concerns. Additional courses and tutorial classes cater to both slow and advanced learners. The institution aligns with Outcome Based Learning objectives, framing Program Outcomes (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), and Course Outcomes (COs) set by the affiliating University. Grievance mechanisms ensure student concerns regarding examinations are addressed promptly.

Awards and Recognition: The college's students and faculty have received few accolades from the Government of West Bengal, the University of Gour Banga, and other organizations for their extensive extension activities.

**Holistic Development Opportunities:** Through community outreach programs organized by the NSS, NCC, and Women's Cell, the college ensures active student participation in projects focusing on environmental sustainability, gender equality, and human values. Internships and field trips enrich experiential learning. Moreover, the college has established a garden of medicinal plants, promoting environmental awareness and education.

**Libraries as Learning Resources:** Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya's Central Library offers a wealth of resources and utilizes initially ILMS Koha software, then shifted to e-Granthalaya for automation. Operating on an open access system, the library provides services including access to e-journals, e-books, the N-LIST program, and web-OPAC. Enhanced by LAN connectivity and a reprographic center, the library infrastructure ensures seamless access to information, supported by CCTV surveillance for security.

**ICT Infrastructure:** The college places significant emphasis on cutting-edge IT infrastructure and software development to support academic and administrative functions. With 100Mbps Wi-Fi connectivity and  $24\times7$  support, the campus fosters a secure and connected learning environment essential for modern education.

**Maintenance and Quality Assurance:** Regular maintenance and quality checks are conducted to uphold the functionality of essential facilities such as computers, water purifiers, air conditioning systems, LCD projectors, public address systems, and laptops. These systems undergo periodic upgrades and are supported by a team of

technical experts. Maintenance expenditures are subject to approval by the Finance Committee and Governing Body, with audit reports ensuring accountability and efficient resource utilization.

Is the intent of our education-

Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya, the Centre of Learning, dreams of and determines to be the Centre of Excellence. The institution accentuates the values of not only going through books, but also growing through life.

For the fulfilment and prosperity of the vision and mission of any institution, it needs a systematically designed academic curriculum. Our institution, however, cannot design its own academic course since it is already well planned and organised by the University of Gour Banga, under which the College has been affiliated to. However, our faculty members actively contribute to curriculum planning and delivery through their involvement in Boards of Studies for subjects like **English**, **Sanskrit**. Our institution, rather, ensures the application and materialisation of the effective curriculum through different measurable means.

- Before each academic session, orientation classes are held, fostering student-teacher interaction and addressing important issues such as discrimination avoidance and campus sustainability.
- The College implements a centrally created routine for undergraduate classes across all departments to ensure effective curriculum delivery within each semester.
- Departmental Routine Alignment: Departments create their own routines in line with the centralized schedule, distributing them among students for clarity.
- Syllabus Distribution: Departments conduct meetings to distribute syllabi, ensuring students receive department-specific study plans.
- A tentative teaching plan is shared with students at the semester's outset, employing diverse teaching methods for effective teaching-learning tools such as, audio-visual aids, power point, and so on., apart from the traditional chalk-and-talk method, lecture-based method, group discussion, quiz etc..
- College hours begin with the National Anthem to foster national and moral values, followed by the college anthem.
- Students are briefed on topics like minority stipends, library usage, and anti-ragging policies, alongside information about various committees and cells within the college.
- Slow learners receive remedial classes if needed, organized by departments.

- Class tests, internal assessments, and other evaluation methods are conducted by the Examination Committee and departments. The College, however, affiliated with the University of Gour Banga, follows the theoretical semester examination dates prescribed by the University for each semester.
- Students are encouraged to participate in subject-related/interdisciplinary seminars, workshops, skill development programmes and competitions to broaden their understanding and enhance their skills.
- Students actively engage in yearly cultural events and sports activities.
- In cases of teacher shortages, special classes and lectures are organized, often featuring scholars and professors from recognized institutions.
- Alumni with suitable qualifications volunteer to teach, following UGC guidelines.
- Selective departments arrange academic excursions to enrich the intellectual faculties of both faculty and students.
- Faculty and student exchange programs with other colleges (as per MoUs) facilitate knowledge exchange and bridge learning gaps.
- The Academic Calendar, includes tentative dates for upcoming events in a particular academic year; it aligns with the Government of West Bengal Holiday List and institution-level events to keep stakeholders informed. #### **Response:**

The introduction of the **CBCS mode** of teaching-learning since 2018 has brought about significant changes in the internal and external assessment systems at our institution, aiming for increased formality and structure. As per the directive of the affiliating University, 25% of the total marks are allocated for internal assessment. This breakdown includes 20% for internal assignments and projects related to the subject taught and 5% for attendance.

During the first induction meeting, students are thoroughly briefed about the mechanisms governing internal and external assessments to ensure transparency and understanding of the evaluation process. Institutional **academic calendars** prominently feature tentative dates for the commencement and completion of exams, facilitating students' preparedness.

Each department organizes various assessment activities such as class tests, presentations, and tutorials to monitor students' performance after the completion of each module. **Records of students' evaluations are maintained from the plus 12 level across semesters to track their progress and provide necessary assistance.** 

To maintain the integrity of examinations, a dedicated examination cell comprising both teaching and non-teaching staff is established. The Principal, IQAC, and Academic Sub-committee analyze results and engage with students to motivate them for improvement. Assignments and mock tests offer students multiple opportunities to enhance their performance.

Parent-teacher meetings serve as a platform to discuss individual student performance with their parents, fostering a collaborative approach to student development. Students are encouraged to engage in self-learning processes, with their original thoughts and ideas receiving due recognition.

A variety of assessment techniques, including MCQs, analytical tests, case studies, book reports, classroom presentations, and individual/group projects, are employed to enrich students' learning experiences. Teachers are encouraged to adopt innovative methods such as open book tests and regular MCQ assessments.

To address any knowledge gaps, remedial classes for struggling students and advanced classes for high achievers are conducted regularly. Re-tests and one-on-one discussions in tutorials provide personalized

attention to students.

Continuous engagement in projects, assignments, and experiential learning activities allows students to translate theoretical knowledge into practical skills. Any grievances related to assessment processes are promptly addressed by the examination committee, with critical cases communicated to the affiliating university for necessary action.

Our institution's assessment processes are designed to foster student success through transparency, support, and innovation, ensuring a conducive learning environment for all.

#### **Response:**

Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya is dedicated to providing a robust educational environment through significant investments in infrastructure and technological facilities. Our campus, sprawling over 17118.2 square meters, is fully enclosed by a guard wall, ensuring a secure environment for students and staff alike.

#### **Infrastructure and Facilities:**

#### 1. Classrooms and Laboratories:

Our classrooms are well-ventilated, furnished, and equipped with sufficient lighting and fans to ensure a comfortable learning environment. Each department boasts its own seminar library, computers, portable projectors & sound system. The college has a dedicated maintenance committee consisting of department HODs and senior teachers who regularly submit infrastructure improvement requests to the principal.

#### 2. Library:

Stocked with 5765 books and providing access to over 3,000 online journals via the N-LIST, our library is a hub of knowledge acquisition. Book acquisition is a collaborative effort involving department heads and is approved by the college library committee. A suggestion box gathers feedback for continuous improvement, and a systematic process ensures timely book returns via a mandatory 'No dues' policy before exams.

#### **3. ICT Infrastructure:**

Our centralized computer lab, equipped with internet facilities, desktops, and printers, supports academic and administrative functions. Additionally, Wi-Fi connectivity across the campus allows access to network resources from almost anywhere. Computers are also available in offices, tecchers' rooms, departments, library, and the principal's chamber.

#### 4. Sports and Fitness:

Maintained by a designated Sports Committee, our sports ground and equipment ensure students have ample opportunities for physical activity. Buniadpur Yoga Centre, along which the institution has signed

an MoU, offers training classes and also organises Yoga Championship events at the institution, promoting both physical and mental well-being.

Modern amenities include ICT enabled classrooms, a 5 KW solar power panel system, a health check-up center, and more. The college prioritizes inclusivity with facilities such as ramps and wheelchairs for differently-abled persons, alongside robust security measures including CCTV surveillance.

#### **Response:**

Buniadpur Mahavidyalaya's library stands as a beacon of modern educational practices, seamlessly blending traditional resources with cutting-edge technology to provide students with a comprehensive and enriching learning experience.

#### Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) - e-Granthalaya:

Library was initially automated using KOHA ILMS but due to some technichal issues the institution has transitioned to e-Granthalaya ILMS, developed by the National Informatics Centre, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, to automate various library functions. This sophisticated system streamlines processes such as cataloguing, circulation, and inventory management, facilitating efficient management of the library's vast collection of books.
